Makerspace Guidelines

Makerspace equipment can be booked by individuals who meet and agree to the following:

- Users must have an ORL card in good standing (Access card and BC One Card are also accepted).
- Users must complete and sign the Accident Waiver & Release of Liability form.
- Users under 14 must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian who is a Makerspace user. (Laser Cutter exception – users under 19)
- Users between 14 and 18 must have their legal guardian sign their Accident Waiver & Release of Liability form.
- Guests of users who enter the makerspace must also complete and sign a valid Accident Waiver & Release of Liability form.
- Users must complete an orientation. Some equipment require certifications.
- Users must adhere to the following Okanagan Regional Library documents, found online at orl.bc.ca/makerspaces or printed at our makerspace locations:
 - o Internet Policy (pg. 41)
- Makerspace Safety Guide
- o Rules of Conduct (pg. 48)
- o Intellectual Property Guidelines
- o <u>Maker Responsibilities</u>
- Contact each Makerspace for reservations details. If no reservations are made; tools and equipment may be available on a first come/first served basis.
- Library staff are available for limited assistance. Users who need extra help are encouraged to book an appointment or take a class.
- Users who damage or misuse equipment will be charged a repair or replacement cost.
- Any materials used in ORL Makerspaces must be pre-approved by ORL staff.
- Users must save their work on an external memory device. It is the user's responsibility to remove any of their files from library equipment. Please note: once our computers restart, all work is lost.
- Users must not leave their project unattended. It is their responsibility that the equipment is operating as intended and to report equipment errors to staff.
- No food or drinks of any kind are permitted.
- Makerspace computers are reserved for digital media projects and are not available for general computer use.
- Locations may limit the number of people in a makerspace or recording studio.



- The makerspaces may be used for lawful purposes only and cannot be used to create content that is:
 - Prohibited by provincial or federal law.
 - o Unsafe, harmful, dangerous, or poses an immediate threat to the well-being of others.
 - o Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the Library environment.
 - o In violation of another's intellectual property rights.
- ORL reserves the right to refuse any request for use of equipment in ORL Makerspaces.
- ORL is not liable for any damaged material or media belonging to people using the ORL
 Makerspace equipment or facilities.
- These guidelines are subject to change without notice.
